SATURDAY, MAY 13 –

Depart Dallas with Turkish Airlines flight #192 nonstop to Istanbul, leaving at 8:20pm.

SUNDAY, MAY 14 – TEL AVIV

Arrive in Istanbul at 3:50pm. Connect with Turkish Airlines flight #864 nonstop to Tel Aviv leaving at 7:45pm and arriving Tel Aviv Ben Gurion Airport at 9:55pm. Upon arrival, you will be met by a Ya'lla Tours Israel representative and transferred to your hotel for overnight. www.danhotels.com/TelAvivHotels/DanPanoramaTelAvivHotel

MONDAY, MAY 15 – TIBERIAS (B,D)

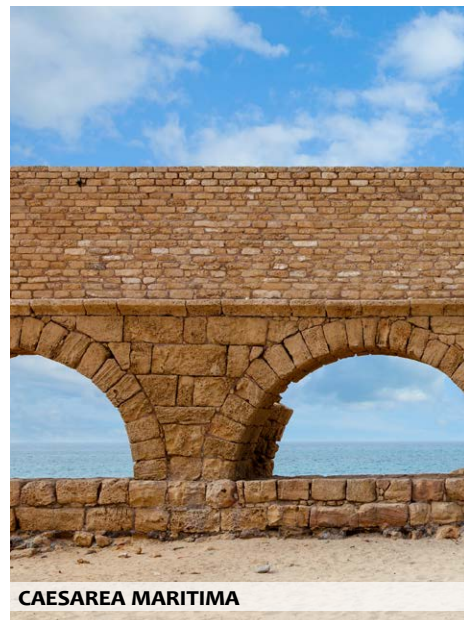
Refreshed from a good night's sleep and a full buffet breakfast, we will visit Joppa, the traditional home of Simon the Tanner (Acts 10:6) and the port city from which the prophet Jonah sailed. Visit the ANU Museum of the Jewish People, newly opened in 2021. In four spectacular wings, the largest Jewish Museum in the world tells the story of the Jewish people, highlighting the creative works and cultural riches of a variety of communities through different periods of history. Then we pass through the fast-growing towns and farms of the Plain of Sharon en route to Caesarea Maritima, a large port city built by Herod the Great to honor Roman Caesar Augustus. Herod built a port in the bay and erected all the cultural institutions found in every great Greco-Roman city, including a theater, a hippodrome, and a luxurious bathhouse. In order to supply water to the city, he built an aqueduct system stretching from the springs of Mt. Carmel to Caesarea. Part of this system is still visible today. The Book of Acts refers repeatedly to Caesarea as the city Peter visited (Acts 10). Then we head for our hotel in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight. GAI BEACH is a sprawling 4-star resort on the waterfront of the Sea of Galilee. www.gaibeach.com

TUESDAY, MAY 16 – TIBERIAS (B,L,D)

After breakfast, we visit the New Testament fishing village of Magdala (Matthew 27:56, 61; 280). Then we take a private boat-ride on the Sea of Galilee on our way to visit the 2,000-year-old Ginosar Boat ("the Jesus boat") discovered in 1986. Visit Capernaum, with an ancient synagogue where Christ taught. Enjoy a St. Peter's Fish lunch by the shores of the Sea of Galilee. Continue south along the Jordan Valley to the ancient Roman city of Beit Shean (1 Samuel 31:10). End the day at the Jordan River for a unique opportunity to renew your baptism. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 17 – TIBERIAS (B,D)

Visit the Mt. of Beatitudes, the traditional site of the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). In the Upper Galilee, stop in Tel Hatzor to view excavations dating to Joshua's conquest of Israel. Continue to Caesarea Philippi (Baniyas Spring), where Peter said to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" (Matthew 16:16). Continue to the Golan Heights and gaze down over the Galilee as the Syrians once did. In the Valley of Tears, hear about Kahalani's battle to secure the Golan Heights during the Yom Kippur War. Continue to Mt. Bental for an outstanding view of the Upper Galilee and the Golan Heights. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

THURSDAY, MAY 18 – TIBERIAS (B,L,D)

After an early breakfast, drive to Mt. Tabor and take a taxi to the top for a visit to the Church of the Transfiguration. Enjoy an outstanding view

of the Jezreel Valley, where the battle of Deborah and the Midianites took place (Judges 5). Drive to Nazareth (Matthew 2:19-23) and visit the Annunciation Church, where tradition says the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary (Luke 1:26-38), and the Crusader Church. Continue to Nazareth Village for a first-hand experience of the way of life in Galilee during the days of Jesus, including a biblical-style lunch. Stop at Mt. Precipice, where the citizens of Nazareth sought to throw the Lord Jesus off the side of a hill (Luke 4:28-30). Continue to Megiddo (I Kings 9:15-19), where archaeological digs have revealed 26 layers of civilization, including fortifications of King Solomon and a water tunnel of King Ahab. Megiddo provides another magnificent view of the fertile Jezreel Valley, the prophesied site of Armageddon, at the crossroads of the ancient Via Maris "freeway." Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

FRIDAY, MAY 19 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

Depart the Sea of Galilee and proceed to Tzipori, one of the most spectacular ruins of a Galilean Village from the days of Jesus. Continue to Akko (ancient Acre), the maritime capital of the Crusader Kingdom. Visit the Knights' Halls, one of the most impressive remains from this period. Drive to Mt. Carmel to visit Muhraqa, where Elijah the prophet "faced off" with the prophets of Ba'al (I Kings 18:20-40). Then climb the Judean Hills to the most beautiful city in the world, JERUSALEM, for a private Shabbat dinner and overnight. KING SOLOMON HOTEL reopened in 2021 after extensive renovations. It is located in a quiet neighborhood on the prestigious King David Street, within walking distance of the Old City and Western Wall and close to the luxury Mamilla open-air shopping mall. www.kingsolomonjer.com

SATURDAY, MAY 20 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

Drive to the eastern slopes of Mt. of Olives to Bethpage to see an authentic, 1st-century tomb. Visit the Church of Pater Noster on the hill where Jesus was inspired with the Lord's Prayer. The walls of the church are covered with the prayer in over 80 languages (Matthew 6:9-13). Continue to the top of Mt. of Olives (Acts 1:9-12) for a panoramic view of the Old City. Walk the "Palm Sunday Walk" to the church of Dominus Flevit ("the Lord weeps," Luke 19:41-44). During construction in 1955, archaeologists uncovered artefacts dating back to the Canaanite period, as well as tombs from both the Second Temple and Byzantine eras. Also unearthed, were the remains of a lovely Byzantine shrine with an elaborate mosaic floor that was incorporated into the church. Continue walking down to the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36). Some of the oldest olive trees in the world are here. Visit the Church of All Nations, which contains the stone traditionally believed to be where Jesus prayed on the night of His betrayal. We will have time for singing, reflection and prayer in a quiet area of the Garden of Gethsemane. We conclude our day with a visit to the Garden Tomb, held by many Protestants to be the actual location of the burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ (John 19:41-42 and Luke 23:53-54). We will have some time for prayer and meditation and Holy Communion. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

SUNDAY, MAY 21 – JERUSALEM (B,L,D)

Drive to Samuel's Tomb, a fascinating combination of antiquities, terraced, agricultural landscapes, mountain springs and orchards. At the heart of the site is a large building from the crusader period containing the tomb of the prophet Samuel. Continue to Shiloh, where the portable Tabernacle that Moses built in the wilderness was stationed from the time of the conquest until the city's apparent destruction by the Philistines in 1104 BC. "He abandoned the Tabernacle of Shiloh, the tent he had set up among men" (Psalm 78:60). Enjoy a buffet lunch at Shiloh. Return to Jerusalem for some free time for shopping at the Ben Yehuda Pedestrian Mall. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

MONDAY, MAY 22 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

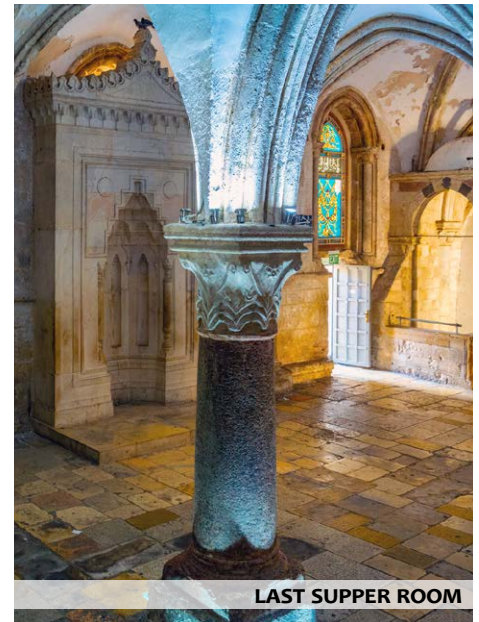
Visit Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial and meet a local cantor for a memorial service there. Drive 6 miles south of Jerusalem to Bethlehem (Micah 5:2 and Luke 2:1-4) to visit the Church of the Nativity, the oldest church in the Holy Land still in use. Construction of this church began in 327AD over the traditional birthplace of the Lord Jesus Christ. Then we continue through the Field of Boaz to see the Shepherds' Field (Luke 2:8-12), where we will revisit the Christmas story with the angels and shepherds of Bethlehem. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

TUESDAY, MAY 23 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

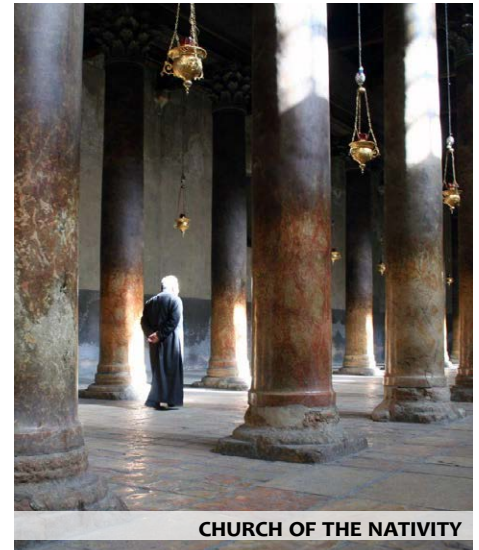
Visit Caiaphas Palace, also known as the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu (John 18:12), and see the cistern where Jesus was held before he was taken to Pilate and the Roman steps he walked from the Kidron Valley. Continue to Mt. Zion to visit King David's Tomb and the Last Supper Room. Next, we will visit the City of David and see excavations which reveal the time of King David. If weather permits, we will walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel and visit the Pool of Siloam where Jesus sent the blind man to be healed. Walk the Pilgrims Tunnel direct to the Old City. See the ancient Southern Steps and the Hulda Gates (II Kings 22:14) which originally led up to the Temple entrance where Jesus is known to have taught and fought with the money changers. Walk to the Western Wall, the holiest site in Judaism and the only visible remains of Herod's splendid Second Temple, where Jesus walked and taught. Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel, huge arched spaces just north of the Western Wall, which link to a water tunnel cut through the rock to the north, apparently dug in the Hasmonean period (163 to 37 BC). Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 24 – (B)

Depart Tel Aviv at 8:30am nonstop to Istanbul with Turkish Airlines flight #865 arriving at 10:50am. Connect to Turkish Airlines flight #191 nonstop to Dallas, leaving at 2:05pm and arriving at 6:50pm.

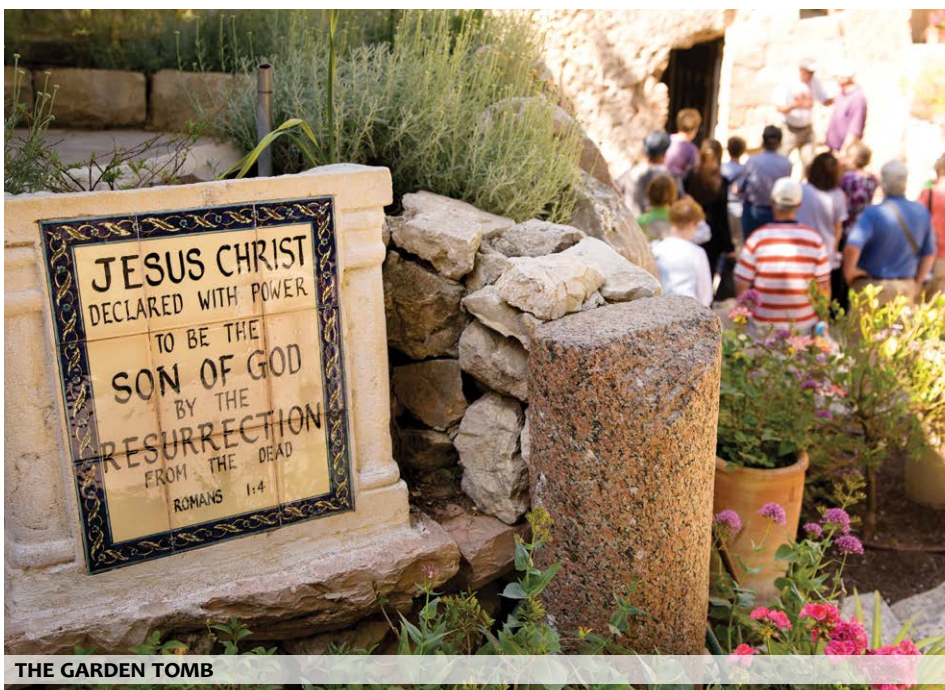

TERMS & CONDITIONS

PRICE:

- The price of the tour is based on a minimum group size of 30 passengers. The price is guaranteed but if due to unforeseen circumstances beyond Ya'lla Tours USA Inc.'s control, our suppliers increase the price, Ya'lla USA Inc. will adjust the price accordingly.
- Price of the airfare portion of the tour is subject to change until the air ticket has been issued.
- Should a single traveler wish to share a room with another traveler, and Ya'lla Tours USA Inc. is unable to match him/her with a roommate, the single room supplement will apply.
- Should the number of participants, 90 days prior to departure, be lower than the published minimum number of participants to operate the tour, the price will be adjusted accordingly or the tour will be cancelled.

DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT POLICY:

- A **nonrefundable** deposit of \$900 per person is required upon registration.
- Final payment is due February 10, 2023.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUND:

- The deposit is nonrefundable.
- For cancellation 89-45 days prior to departure, a cancellation fee of 50% of the tour cost will apply.
- For cancellation 44 or fewer days prior to departure, a cancellation fee of 100% of the tour cost will apply.
- No refund will be paid for unused services such as: transfers, sight-seeing, meals, accommodations, entrance fees, and others listed in the program.
- If Ya'lla Tours USA cancels the trip/tour for reasons beyond its control, a credit voucher will be offered for the land services good for use up to 18 months from the original travel date to any Ya'lla Tours USA destination. Any refund or credit of airfare included by Ya'lla Tours USA in the trip/tour will be determined by the policy of each individual airline.
- Travel insurance is **NONREFUNDABLE**.
